

Construction Employment Outlook

The construction industry currently employs more than 8.1 million people ([‡]igure 1), but more talent is in demand as construction spending is projected to increase over the next few years.²It is estimated that the construction industry will need more than half a million new skilled workers each year.³⁴

There are abundant jobs available in all crafts across the United States, with Craft Laborers continuing to be the number one in-demand craft (Table 1).⁵</sup>
